October 30, 2016 — Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our readings today ponder two powerful truths: God is infinitely greater than we are and God provides every kind of help so we can discover and share in God's glory. The reading from Wisdom reminds us that we are tiny compared to "the LORD of the whole universe." Nevertheless, God preserves and nurtures us out of perfect love. If we feel tiny, weak, and sinful compared to God, we are blessed! God's greatness sustains and strengthens us. Saint Paul encourages the Thessalonian Christians with the same message. He reminds them that God alone makes the Church holy. He prays that everything they undertake will be for the glory of God. Luke's Gospel shows us what this looks like in real life: Zacchaeus, feeling small and excluded, looks for Jesus. Jesus finds him and gives him the strength he needs to repent of his sins and glorify God.

INSTRUCTION MANUAL FOR LIFE If babies came complete with an instruction manual, today's reading from Wisdom would make the perfect guide! Just imagine how Wisdom's words might look in a parent guide: "God has created this baby for you. Congratulations! God would not have made her if he didn't love her like crazy. God's plan is for you to take care of this baby, reminding her constantly that she belongs to God, who will always take perfect care of her. If she should sin, take heart! Reprimand her with love and guide her tenderly to the right path, for this is what God does for you." What a tremendous gift it is to gather for the liturgy and share the scriptures together. Before the beginning of time, God knew we would hear the reading from Wisdom today. God intends for us to take these words to heart.

FREEDOM We are here, in fact, only because God never stops thinking about us. Everything we encounter in our daily lives, then, becomes an opportunity to think about God in return. "How could a thing remain," the Book of Wisdom asks, "unless you willed it?" Confident of God's constant intervention in our daily lives, we can face all created things with freedom. Does a certain event, situation, or item help me grow closer to God? Then I can use it well. Does anything draw me away from God? Then I can try to let it go. Saint Paul warns the Thessalonians not to be alarmed by false prophecies that distract the church from righteousness and true worship. In their case, it seems, they are too attached to something other than God and need to rediscover their freedom. Zacchaeus, on the other hand, approaches creation with wonderful freedom: he embraces a tree, literally, using it to climb up to get a glimpse of Jesus. The closer we are to Jesus, the greater our freedom.

## October 30, 2016

Dear Family,

The author of the Book of Wisdom speaks of God as the Lord of the cosmos. God looks upon the world as the harvester regards the single grain that falls from the balance, the scale that measures the harvest. For the harvester every grain is important, and the author of Wisdom says that God looks upon the whole world with the same attention and care. The second analogy portrays the same attentiveness; God sees the world as though it were a single drop of dew. This is a God of immeasurable care and compassion.

In Luke's story of Zacchaeus, Jesus fulfills that very role; he "has come to seek and to save what was lost." There is something amusing and even ridiculous about the life of Zacchaeus. He is no ordinary tax collector (a group despised by the citizens), he is the chief tax collector. He must have been slightly embarrassed - a person of his position having to climb a tree to see Jesus. But he sets aside any personal inhibitions and climbs up.

Then an amazing thing happens. Jesus announces that he is coming to stay at his house. Jesus becomes both guest and host at the table of a sinner.

When we gather for liturgy, we believe that we encounter the Lord in the Word, in the bread and wine that become sacrament, in the priest, and in each other. At the Eucharistic liturgy, the Lord is both guest and host. He becomes the meal and the host at our Eucharistic table, and in the procession to and reception of communion we are transformed.

Some questions for reflection:

What are two promises exchanged in the Gospel passage for this weekend? What phrase from the First Reading is spiritual wisdom for you? What does the conversation between Jesus and Zacchaeus mean for discipleship?

Please give a warm welcome to our two diocesan retired priests who will be celebrating Eucharist with us this weekend. Fr. Jon Koehler will celebrate the Vigil Mass on Saturday. Fr. Pat Mascarella will celebrate the Sunday Masses. Please remember to keep them and all of our retired priests in your prayers and petitions. I am grateful for their willingness to serve.

I will be out of town Wednesday, October 26th, for my annual Tennis Weekend with my Tennis Buds. I'll be back in the office on Wednesday, November 2nd, but I'll see you for All Saints Day for all Masses.
