May 28, 2017 — The Ascension of the Lord

Today we celebrate the ascension of Jesus into heaven, his departure after the Crucifixion, the Resurrection, and all the appearances to the disciples. Acts and Ephesians look back at the time just before Jesus leaves and then at its immediate aftermath, still trying to understand what has happened and what is expected of those who were left behind. The readings remind us that the disciples are still not certain what all this means to them. But one thing is certain: Jesus is gone and they are struggling with what to do next. Matthew tells us that even as they believed in Jesus, they doubted. Jesus responds to their doubt with a call to work. He tells them to "make disciples of all nations."

UP, UP AND AWAY The reading from Acts gives us a pretty complete description of the Ascension. Jesus was lifted up and taken from their sight but not before the disciples ask lots of questions about what will happen. The disciples are still thinking that the kingdom of Israel will be restored. Jesus answers them with a promise of power from the Holy Spirit and a commission that they be witnesses not just to Israel but to the ends of the earth. But the disciples are still thinking small. Jesus knows that the meaning of his death and resurrection is not small. Ephesians offers a glimpse of the great gifts of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. The disciples cannot even imagine what this means for them as they stand staring into the sky. Jesus tells them one more time that their work is to tell everyone about his life and work, to baptize them, and to teach them his commandments.

NEVER CAN SAY GOOD-BYE The disciples still thought this was just about their life and their world. They are reminded by Jesus that what they have lived through with him, his life, death, and resurrection, is greater and more far-reaching than they can yet imagine. This is not just about the kingdom of Israel. This is about all nations. This is not just about witnessing in Jerusalem, Judea, and Samaria. This work will take them to the ends of the earth. It is an enormous undertaking that we and the disciples have been given. It seemed impossible to the disciples then and it seems impossible to us now. But it is not. It is possible because we are not alone in this work. Jesus is with us not for a day or a week or even our lifetime. Jesus is with us always, until the end of the age.

Dear Family,

The Solemnity of the Ascension leads us into the final days of the Easter season as we prepare for the great feast of Pentecost. Luke, the author of Acts, recalls Jesus' instruction to wait in Jerusalem for the baptism of the Holy Spirit - which will be different from John's baptism with water. The gift of the Holy Spirit will enable the disciples to be Christ's witnesses "to the ends of the earth."

In today's second reading from St. Paul to the Ephesians, Paul begins with a series of petitions. Like the intercessions in our Sunday liturgy, they have two purposes. First, they describe the needs that the Church discerns are necessary for spiritual living. Second, they express faith in God, who alone, through Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit, can provide what the faithful seek.

In Matthew's version of the Ascension, Jesus and his disciples return to Galilee where his mission began. The mountain setting tells us this is a crucial moment in the mission of the disciples. Jesus' commission to continue building up the Kingdom of God had been passed on to each of us. As Pope Francis says, we are "missionary disciples." Jesus' promise that he will accompany us at all times is the source of our hope and our courage.

Some questions for reflection:

What words in the readings seem to indicate a movement of transition?

When have you worried about your ability to be a disciple?

How might the commission of the disciples and the dismissal at the end of Mass be related?

Please give a warm Plaquemine welcome to Rev. Fabian Rodas Aguilar who will be with us this weekend for a Mission Appeal. How appropriate that as we celebrate the Ascension and the sending forth of the Apostles into the world that we would be lead in prayer and worship this weekend by a missionary.

Please remember that next weekend, Pentecost Sunday, we will have a Ministry Fair after all Masses. Please consider continuing in your present ministry. Likewise, we seek more of our brothers and sisters to join in the work of the vineyard. There are a variety of ways in which we can serve. Please pray about your participation in ministry and hear God's call to you to be God's hands, voice, eyes and heart.

Please remember all our service men and women who have given the ultimate sacrifice of their lives for our country. Offer a prayer at home either at meal or when appropriate to give thanks for their making our way of life possible.

I will leave for Tennessee to visit my brother and family Friday the 26th after the evening wedding here at St. John. I will be back in the office on Wednesday, June 7th.

St. John the Evangelist has many opportunities to serve and evangelize through its ministries. Our volunteers are vital in sustaining these outreach activities to others in faith. The ministries are in the areas of Worship, Spiritual Life, Community Life and Religious Education.

COMMUNITY LIFE MINISTRIES serve the needs of parishioners and the community at large with fellowship, hospitality and social support:

Ministers of Hospitality - Coffee, milk, juice and donuts are provided for parishioners to gather after 7:30 am and 9:00 am Masses on Sundays in the parish hall and visit with each other. Contact Marsha Dupont to volunteer to help with this welcoming activity.

Community Lay Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist bring Communion to those who are unable to attend Mass. They may be ill, confined to their homes, in the hospital or care facilities. Please contact Joe Roetker or Marion Badeaux to help with this important ministry.

Communion Services at the nursing homes are provided by Deacon Ricard, Patricia and Bern Ebert and Lorraine Hidalgo at both Legacy and Plaquemine Manor. The service is conducted on Friday at 10:00 am, alternating nursing homes weekly. Volunteers are needed to assist in the service, say the Rosary afterwards and distribute Communion to those bedridden. Please contact Deacon Ricard, Patricia Ebert or Lorraine Hidalgo to volunteer.

Prayer Blankets for the Sick - Blessed prayer blankets are provided to parishioners and others who may be associated with our parishioners who are suffering from serious illness or injury as a gesture of our love and our prayers for God's mercy. Please contact Jane Gauthreaux to volunteer to make blankets or if you know of someone in need of a prayer blanket.

Brothers' Keeper Food Bank - Nonperishable food items can be donated any time and deposited in the baskets located near the Baptistry in church. Volunteers are also needed to help distribute food on Thursday mornings to those needy community members. In addition there is a thrift store that sells used clothing, accessories and other house items. Contact Amy Flatau or Margie Lepere to help with this ministry.

Fishes & Loaves Committee – This ministry assists the families who have lost a loved one and would like to use the parish hall after a funeral. To request the use of the parish hall, please contact the parish office. This committee, led by Laura Badeaux and Beverly Percle, provide assistance to the family by setting up, receiving the food, serving the food and cleaning up afterwards. There are monthly teams with a team captain.

Prison Ministry - Parishioners visit the local prisons and jails and evangelize to those incarcerated at this time. Weekly visits include Sacred Scripture and devotional services. Please contact Deacon Alfred Ricard or Mercedes Curry to learn more about this ministry and to volunteer.

Respect Life supports the awareness of the dignity and sanctity of life by holding a vigil for 40 days near the Delta Women's Clinic in Baton Rouge. Christmas Giving Tree - Each Christmas, parishioners volunteer to purchase gifts for 200 children in the Plaquemine area who might not otherwise enjoy the giving and receiving of gifts during this holy season of Jesus Christ's birth. Candy canes with the children's names adorn a Christmas tree at the back of the church. Parishioners take the candy canes, purchase gifts appropriate for the age and gender of the child and return the gifts to the church.
