Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 11, 2022 Just Look at the Cross

The common theme of today's readings is forgiveness. The Gospel is one familiar to us all, and Paul in the second reading highlights his story of receiving God's mercy. But the first reading might cause us to wonder if God was always so forgiving. God and Moses come across like a couple of parents deciding whether they should punish their children. One, the Lord, points out how bad Israel has been. The other, Moses, points out how good God is, in the promise to make them a great nation. The important point is that God relented and forgave the people.

In each case, great sins are forgiven--not because the people deserved it, but because they were loved.

My favorite line in the second reading is "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" (1Timothy 1:15)-not to find the wealthiest people to build his kingdom, or the nicest, or the holiest; he came to save sinners.

The Pharisees and scribes did not get this. That was one of the reasons they wanted to kill Jesus. And yet, when they did just that, Jesus' death on the cross brought forgiveness for us all.

Remember the story in Genesis 18, of Abraham bargaining with God not to destroy Sodom if he could find a few good people? Maybe he should have "reminded" God of that divine mercy instead of hoping to find enough good people to spare the town. Sometimes we can't believe that God would love us so much as to forgive any sin. Just look at the cross if you need a reminder.

Dear Family:

One of the themes in today's readings is forgiveness, a need for which each of us is very aware. In the reading from Exodus, we hear that the Israelites sinned by turning away from God and worshiping an idol they had made with their hands. Moses, once again, intercedes for the people by imploring God to remember the saving deeds that God had done on behalf of this chosen people.

Meanwhile, the passage from the opening chapter of the First Letter of Timothy presents us with a confession of Paul, the well-known persecutor of the early followers of Jesus. Paul speaks boldly of his arrogance, his sinfulness, and the unbounded mercy of God. It was God's gracious love that touched Paul's heart and transformed him into an apostle.

Today's Gospel from Luke puts together three parables, each of which is worthy of more attention than we can provide. The first two parables, the shepherd who has lost a sheep and the woman who has lost a coin, are very similar. Both the man and the woman are overjoyed that something lost has been found, and therefore, both celebrate. The well-known parable of the prodigal son is a reminder that God's love for each of us, those who have worked tirelessly to be faithful and those who have strayed and are loved, is deeper than we can possibly imagine.

Some questions for reflection:

- Recall a situation when you knew that only God's saving grace could lift you up from distress. How did feeling God's mercy affect you?
- Which of today's three parables captures your imagination? What feelings and images in those parables touch you?
- With which of the two sons do you identify? Consider journaling with a sibling about the parable, and be open to the other's experience.

This weekend will be the first weekend the 9:00 a.m. Choir will be back leading our songful praise at our Sunday Eucharistic Celebration. We pray they have had a good summer break and that God will bless them and us as we move through the rest of this liturgical year. Medric Smith, Jr., our Music Director, has asked me to invite new members to the choir. I know the pandemic caused some of us to shy away from choir participation. Come Sing With Us! Let us Praise the Lord together in Song. Please prayerfully consider continuing, joining and/or returning to the Choir.

It is amazing to recognize that 21 years ago today the attack on our country took place. Thousands died that day and many have died due to illnesses caused by this tragedy. We keep them in mind. We hold them in prayer. We will not forget. God Bless Our Country!


