

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 18, 2022 The Cleaver Crook

The parable in today's Gospel has a crooked steward who is commended by his master for being prudent, or clever, trying to protect himself. Jesus wanted us to be just as clever in serving the Lord. Let's look at the first two readings and how they challenge us to do more.

The reading from Amos talks about those "who trample upon the needy and destroy the poor" (Amos 8:4). The challenge here is to ask yourself, "What do I do for the poor?" Most parishes have organizations to help the needy and are happy to get volunteers. Do you ever think of praying for the poor?

Speaking of prayer, our second reading also challenges us to do more. Paul recommends prayers for "kings and for all in authority" (1 Timothy 2:2). It's easy to pray for friends and family; how much time do we give to prayers for government leaders

and executives? Paul reminds us that God wants everyone to be saved (1 Timothy 2:4), sinners as well as saints, terrorists and embezzlers, atheists and agnostics. I'll bet you don't spend much time praying for the "bad guys." Yet Jesus said, "Love your enemies. Pray for those who hurt you" (Matthew 5:44). I can't say I've ever heard anyone say that was their favorite Bible passage. But if Jesus expects more from those who love him, who are we to let him down?

Dear Family:

Today's reading from the prophet Amos depicts the injustice of sellers in the marketplace. The poor are treated unjustly, something God will not forget. In contrast to the actions in the marketplace, the responsorial psalm for today emphasizes what God does on behalf of the poor. God "raises up the lowly from the dust; from the dunghill he lifts up the poor / to set them with princes, / with the princes of his own people." The psalm expresses a special love for the poor, for those who are treated unfairly.

The passage from the First Letter of Timothy invites us to reflect on communal intercessory prayer. It is right that we pray for one another, even those individuals with whom we may have disagreements. When we pray, we ought to ask God for blessings on those we love and on those toward whom we hold no affection.

Today's parable from Luke is challenging and not very easy to understand. While the steward is recognized as being quite clever, he is looking out for himself, no one else. Yes, the men who owed the steward's master must have been happy for the reduction of their debt. The steward lowers their payment because he wants to have some people to turn to when he is fired. At the very end of this parable, we find insight into its meaning: "no servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Some questions for reflection:

- How do you see the poor taken advantage of in your community? What might you do to help change the plight of the poor in our town?
- Be attentive to the universal prayer, also called the prayer of the faithful. How do the petitions invite us to show compassion?
- Do I sometimes hesitate to help those in need? Imagine that Jesus is sitting with you. Talk with him about why you sometimes do not help people when you could.

This Sunday we also celebrate those involved with the teaching of our Catholic Faith. We ask God's blessing to be on our Catechists and all teachers in our Catholic Schools and all Catholic teachers in private schools, government run schools, colleges and universities. As Roman Catholics we give great importance to God's blessing us in our work for the Kingdom of God. Let us give thanks to the Lord for these generous brothers and sisters and keep them in our prayers this school year.


