November 13, 2016 — Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings take a fearless look at reality and reach a conclusion that we all know: life is hard. The prophet Malachi preaches fire and brimstone, warning us that evildoers will perish in flames. Saint Paul offers his own warning to the Thessalonians: keep busy, but never become a busybody. He reminds Christians that the apostles themselves worked in "toil and drudgery" as a model for how we ought to contribute to our community. The Gospel returns to the apocalyptic tone of Malachi, describing the utter chaos of the end-times. We will know the end is near when violence, catastrophe, and hatred dominate the earth. But we must not fear! God's saving plan brings peace to our hearts. Malachi speaks of the sun's "healing rays," and Jesus himself promises to protect every hair on our heads.

HOT ENOUGH FOR YOU? The reading from Malachi today consists of only two sentences. The first sentence describes the fire of God's justice, "blazing like an oven," incinerating sinners. "But for you who fear my name," the next sentence explains, "there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays." One single element--heat--has vastly different effects. God's intense, fiery justice burns those who reject it, but offers healing warmth to those who long for God. Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians suggests that busyness can have similarly opposite effects. Rigorous work can be helpful or harmful, depending on what's in our hearts. Are we building people up in our work, or tearing them down? "Minding the business of others" might involve jealous thoughts and unhelpful desires to look better than others. Ideally, we tend to our work out of love for family and the wider community.

THE GOSPEL TRUTH Even our love of life could harm us or help us, depending on what we're living for. Luke's Gospel today describes wars, disasters, and persecution. In desperate times like those that Jesus identifies, our instinct is to save ourselves. If we cling to this life too frantically, we might lie or offer false testimony to avoid religious persecution. Jesus calls us to a different way: tell the truth. Proclaim faith in Jesus, even in terrible times or awkward situations. At work, among friends, at the ballot box, on weekends, and yes, even in the face of death, we are asked to show clearly that we believe in the saving power of Jesus Christ. Jesus knows the risk involved in our witness: we will be hated. Even so, we cling to Christ. "By your perseverance," Jesus promises, "you will secure your lives." Our souls are more precious than a comfortable life or extravagant wealth. Jesus died to save our souls. He will never abandon us. He always provides exactly what we need.

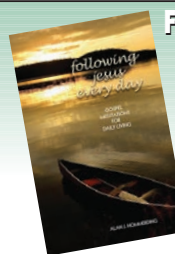
