Pentecost Sunday May 28, 2023

... from every nation under heaven. (Acts 2:5)

Today's first reading makes it pretty clear: the Holy Spirit wants everyone to hear the good news and come together through faith in Jesus. Men and women from all over the known world were in Jerusalem for the feast of Pentecost, and they didn't all speak the same language. But when the Spirit came upon the believers gathered in the upper room, that massive crowd heard the disciples proclaiming God's mighty works in their own languages, and that manifestation of God's power helped them come to believe!

That miracle of God gathering people from all over the world wasn't limited to the first Pentecost. Consider Philip preaching to the Ethiopian court official (Acts 8:26-40) or Peter preaching to the Roman centurion Cornelius (10:34-48) or Paul preaching to the philosophers of Athens (17:22-34). The Spirit came in power both upon those who preached and those who heard. He broke down barriers and brought people together through the gospel.

The Holy Spirit still wants to dismantle walls between people from all walks of life and bring them together. And by virtue of your baptism, you are called to participate in that mission.

How? You can start right where you live. You're sure to encounter someone who might not "speak your language." Maybe someone in your family or among your neighbors has a different worldview than you do. Maybe there are people who come from a different country or from a different generation. Bring Jesus to them. Just say a prayer, open your mouth, and trust the Spirit to work through you to bring them together.

The Holy Spirit is still eager to bring us all together in Christ. Let him fill you on this special day!

Dear Family:

Happy Pentecost! I pray this Easter Season has been filled with abundant blessings in the Risen Lord.

The early Church believed humanity had received a fresh start. After the resurrection, a mysterious vitality motivated the disciples. Some new force subtly coordinated their efforts, giving them energy, insight, and courage. The Bible gives this power different names, but it is often called the Holy Spirit.

When Jesus shared the Holy Spirit with his disciples, they changed in two ways. First, they received the gift of peace, God's presence quieted the disciples' fears and gave them joy. They knew that, no matter what they faced, God was always with them.

Their newfound peace freed their hearts. In that freedom, they discovered a second gift, an ability to discern the causes of sin and the power to overcome it. The Spirit conferred the power to untangle the mess that humans make of life and the world.

This fresh start humanity received is also clear in this Sunday's first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles. The mighty wind and the tongues of fire were just the opening act; the climax came when the members of the crowd heard of the mighty deeds of God in their own languages. The barriers that stood between God's love and human understanding had started to fall.

The Holy Spirit made God's love clear. The Spirit also inspired Christians to love each other, as this Sunday's second reading shows. Addressing the spiritual competition that had arisen among Christians, Paul reminded them that the Spirit coordinated all human effort toward the fulfillment of Christ's mission. This too was a fresh start. Cooperation and conflict, order and chaos, had struck an uneasy balance for so long that no one could imagine a different world. Now, in the Spirit, cooperation would be ever stronger, drawing people together to work for God's glory and Christ's mission. This Sunday's responsorial psalm recognizes that same cooperation on a cosmic scale. As the Spirit renews creation, everything works together for the glory of God.

Some questions for reflection: What fresh start has God made in your life? What did the disciples fear so much that they kept the doors locked? With whom can you work to fulfill Christ's mission?

This weekend we welcome Rev. Honesto Gile, a priest from the Philippines, who will make an appeal to us for the work in the Missions of his diocese. Please offer him a warm St. John welcome.

I will be making a trip to visit my brother, Paul, and his family in Tennessee and to help with some work on his plot of land. I haven't seen him since my aunt/godmother's funeral in January. So, the Daigle boys will for sure be having a good reunion. I'll return for Masses next weekend. Please keep me in your prayers as I travel. Assurance of prayers for you as well.




