

Death no longer has power over him. (Romans 6:9)

It's easy to skim over Paul's words here. Of course death has no power over Jesus! He has already died and come back to life. But the power of Jesus' resurrection did more than make him able to pass through walls and ascend into heaven. Paul also says that Jesus has "died to sin once and for all" (Romans 6:10, emphasis added). He isn't the only one whose life has been changed. By his death and resurrection, he has destroyed the power of sin and death over everyone. And Baptism gives us access to all the blessings of his risen life!

Now, experience tells us that Baptism doesn't mean that we can walk through walls as Jesus did. And it certainly doesn't guarantee a life of sinless perfection. But it does release us from the permanence of sin and death.


Because Baptism unites us with Jesus, the deathless one, we have the hope of a resurrection to the same eternal life that Jesus knows. Death is no longer a tragic end for us; it's the doorway to a new, glorious beginning!

Because Baptism immerses us into Jesus' own dying and rising, we are no longer hopelessly tethered to sin. We have received a new grace enabling us to say no to temptation whenever we choose. We are now free to "live in newness of life" (Romans 6:4).

If this sounds too good to be true, be assured that it's both very good and very true. Spend time today reading this passage over and over. Ask the Spirit to show you how you yes, even you—are indeed set free from the power of sin and death!

"Jesus, I praise you! By your cross and resurrection, you have set me free!"

Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me." Matthew 10:38

July 2, 2023

#### **Dear Family:**

Our readings this weekend show the way God's blessing transforms believers and those with whom they come in contact. Our responsorial psalm emphasizes the way God builds up those who believe. Simple trust in God's promises brings rejoicing, illumination, exaltation, strength, and security. Those who respond with their whole selves to God's promises of justice and eternal love find themselves transformed by joy.

In the second reading, Paul focuses on the effects of discipleship. Baptism allows us to become like Jesus Christ. We live eternally because Christ was first victorious over death. We will rise in glory because Christ now lives in the glory of the Father. In Paul's mind, baptism allows a disciple to become everything that Jesus Christ was and is.

If Christians are to be like Jesus, they must undertake a similar mission to change the lives of those around them. Christians bear the Holy Spirit wherever they go, and that Spirit is always at work. Prophets in ancient Israel foreshadowed this reality. Kindness to them resulted in blessings, as the first reading recounts. The Shunammite woman's deepest wish - to become a mother - received its fulfillment because of her generosity to the prophet Elisha.

Jesus imagines a similar reality for his disciples. In the section of Matthew's Gospel from which this passage comes, Jesus offers words of encouragement to his disciples just as they are about to go out on their missionary journeys. As Elisha and other prophets bore God's blessing to any who helped them, so God would bless any who showed kindness to the bearers of Christ's Gospel.

Christ's disciples today must remember the blessing they can be to others. Christ's Spirit is a twofold source of grace, first for the disciple who bears it and then for any who receive them.

Some questions for reflection:

What does the Shunammite woman's hospitality indicate about her faith? How has Christ helped you become more like him? How has another person's life changed because of Christ at work in you?

With the coming of the National observance of Independence Day, hot days are in our forecast for a while. No doubt, we have all felt that the Church Air Conditioning system is finding it difficult to keep up. Dr. Susanne Greggio from the Diocesan Office visited both our St. John and St. Clement buildings. Help is on the way. Let's continue to pray the current system at St. John can hold on until we have the go ahead to replace.

Our 100 Years Campaign Committee will have another meeting this month as we begin preparing to come to you, the faithful of St. John Church, for your help in this campaign.

For those wondering when we will begin offering the Precious Blood at weekend Masses, we will begin on Sunday, August 6th for the Feast of The Transfiguration of the Lord.

I pray you are all enjoying a summer of rest and recreation.


