Jesus must have shocked the priests and elders when he said that prostitutes and tax collectors would enter the kingdom of God before them. After all, his listeners had spent their whole lives being faithful to the Law. But Jesus' point was not so much about final salvation as

about our daily choices.
Remember the parable about the two sons. The second son said what his father wanted to hear, with no intention of doing it. The first was honest about not wanting to go to the vineyard, but then decided to do it anyway. suspect the father of those men knew what each would

or would not do.

And whom do we want to imitate? Are we honest enough to look at our lives and repent of our hatred, our selfishness, or whatever keeps us in sin, and then to follow Jesus with our whole heart? We may not always like doing what God asks of us, but God is an understanding Father who can accept our weaknesses and forgive them when we are ready to return to him. and forgive them when we are ready to return to him. Pastor's Letter

Dear Family:

It can be a challenge to recognize God at work in ours and others' lives. In the first reading, Ezekiel pleads with Israel to recognize



with Israel to recognize that it was not God but they who caused the invasion and social collapse they faced. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus reminds Israel's priests and elders that, although they know how to draw near to God, they failed to recognize the desire of sinners to do the same.

First-century Jews believed tax collectors and prostitutes benefited from Israel's national humiliation. Tax collectors enriched themselves by plundering Jews on Rome's behalf. Prostitutes earned much of their living from the Roman soldiers who occupied Israel. Both groups symbolized Israel's oppression, and faithful Jews resented them thoroughly.

Such attitudes kept the faithful from noticing that many tax collectors and prostitutes had a real desire for change. Many responded with eagerness to the mercy that John the Baptist and Jesus showed them. The Gospels contain many stories of the sudden and total conversion of tax collectors and prostitutes. Their desire for change was real, and as they transformed their lives, they gave evidence that God was at work among them.

Resentments robbed many people of the humility that would have allowed them to see and join God's work. Pride obscured the need for grace, and persecution led them to believe they earned God's love through suffering. Such entitlement kept Israel's chief priests and elders from recognizing their need for divine mercy. Because of this, they were unable to identify the effects of divine mercy among sinners and they failed to join God's effort.

Such problems remain today. God's kingdom includes all parts of a polarized world. Christ's disciples must be able to recognize God's work wherever they find it and be willing to join in the task. This is how we, as Paul exhorts, can have in us the same attitude that is in Christ.

Some questions for reflection:

When has the work of grace surprised you? How can you make Christ's humility your own? If Jesus preached this parable today, who would our "tax collectors and prostitutes" be?

Thanks for all of you who stayed after Masses this month for the Town Hall meetings on the 100 year campaign. Your questions and insights will help us as we move forward with our plans. Please continue to pray for the success of our campaign.


