

Third Sunday of Advent December 17, 2023 Reasons to Rejoice

Saint Paul seems to be throwing out a handful of sayings that may sound overly optimistic, but are actually very practical. "Rejoice always"? If we pray constantly and thank God for all that happens to us, we have reason to rejoice. Even the things we don't like can be turned to good by God. God allows sin because it leads to forgiveness, an experience of God's love for us. And God allows even death, because God can bring up to charged life because God can bring us to eternal life.

When Paul tells us not to quench the Spirit he means we should be open to what the Holy Spirit moves us to do. "Prophetic utterances" refer to things that other people were inspired to proclaim. If we pray constantly (1 Thessalonians 5:17), the distractions of this world will not keep us from hearing the Spirit within us. We won't be so critical of others that we miss what the Spirit is telling us through them. **SATHAND JAMES 5:8** Celebration of Christmas, or God's final coming in glory. I'd say that's a reason to rejoice.





Pastor's Letter

Dear Family:

The Song of Mary, also known as the Magnificat, is basically a repetition of Hannah's thanksgiving prayer in 1 Samuel 2 after God answered Hannah's prayer for a child. Not to be missed is the emphasis these words place on how God turns things upside down or right side up. Those who are proud, powerful, and rich, God will scatter, bring down, and send away empty. In contrast, those who are lowly and hungry, God will lift up and fill with good things. Instead of treating all in the same way, in Mary's song God operates with a preferential option for those who

are humble and on the margins, such as the young, pregnant, and unwed Mary.

The word "humble" appropriately describes the attitude of John the Baptizer in John 1. Although John could make himself sound more impressive before the religious authorities, he does not make himself the focus of his work. Instead, he confesses that neither his status nor his work is comparable to those of Jesus.

A similar message is found in Isaiah 61, where God's good news and favor are said to be focused upon "the poor," "the brokenhearted," "the captives," and "the prisoners." Isaiah 61 is part of what scholars call Third Isaiah 9 Isaiah 56-66), written during a time that the exiles began the difficult task of restoration upon their return from Babylon to Palestine. When Luke's Jesus begins his ministry (Luke 4:18-19), he will choose these very words from Isaiah to characterize his ministry.

The passage in Thessalonians suggests that to be "blameless" in God's advent, we must not only pray and give thanks but also know and do what is good by not quenching the Spirit but attending to and carefully discerning what God may want to tell us.

Some questions for reflection:

Who are the "poor" "the brokenhearted," "the captives, " and "the prisoners" in our society and world today? How much of what we do today is upholding or challenging the status quo?

What is the difference between a humble ministry of preparation such as John's and the word done by Jesus?

Many folks try to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this time in preparation for Christmas. Please remember that we have confessions every Tuesday evening from 5:30 - 5:45 and Saturday afternoons from 3:00 -3:30. For your convenience, I will also be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Tuesday evening, December 19th, from 6:30 to 7:30.

Many thanks to Katie Berthelot, her family and others who helped organize our Christmas Giving Tree ministry this Advent. Thanks as well to all of you who have heard the call of the Gospel to respond to the needy in this season. May God Bless you all.

Regarding the celebration of Christmas: Our schedule is on the Christmas Card sent from the church. Saturday, December 23rd at 4:00 p.m. will be the one Mass that celebrates the 4th Sunday of Advent. There will be no morning Masses on December 24th.
