Great Expectations

Christmas can be disappointing. We remember the Christmases from our childhood, all the joy, the excitement, and the fun we had. When we grow up, we have to shop for gifts, write and mail the cards, put up the decorations, and do all the preparations that seem to stress us out. We may be sad that the day did not meet our expectations. Now that most of that is done, we can reflect on how the first Christmas upset all expectations.

I'm sure Joseph never expected to have a child so soon. And those Jews who looked forward to the coming of a Messiah never expected him to come as a baby. Yet God had his reasons for coming in this way. Jesus was born in a stable because no one had room for him. The first to see him were the shepherds, the migrant workers of the time. The political leaders (Herod and friends) wanted to kill him.

Jesus was born in this way to show that he came not for the important and wealthy, but for the poor and outcast. So today he continues to come to us in the homeless, the undocumented immigrant, the sick, those in prison, the unborn infant, that we might find him where we least expect. Can we learn to see him in the unexpected, in our trials and difficulties, our own weaknesses? When we do, we will celebrate what Christmas is truly about.



Pastor's Letter

Dear Family:

From Deacon Ricard, our parish and school staff and myself, Merry Christmas. Our scriptures for Christmas offer us the beginning of

the Good News of Jesus Christ's coming to our world.

Unlike Luke's Gospel, Matthew's birth story of Jesus focuses on Joseph rather than on Mary. Joseph is introduced by Matthew as a "righteous" man because of how he responds to the angel's message. Hearing about Mary's immaculate conception and the role of Jesus in God' salvation plan, Joseph does what the angel tells him without hesitation. In Matthew's Gospel, the "righteous" are those who do the will of God.

As the text shows, Joseph's righteousness also relates to what he would do and would not do with his pregnant bestowed before he heard from the angel. Joseph could have taken action to punish Mary according to the law, yet he simply plans to "divorce her quietly". According to the parable of the sheep and the goats, we will be judged by what we do or don't do for "these least" ones. The will of God that we must carry out in Matthew is to care for those who are weak and defenseless: the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, the imprisoned. Joseph's decision to protect a vulnerable woman is a sign that he is righteous "sheep." Jesus is Emmanuel, meaning "God is with us", but God's faithful presence (as we see today in the passages from the psalm and from Isaiah) often, in Matthew's view, takes place through human followers of God.

Joseph's plan not to disgrace or punish Mary is reason for him to be called "righteous." When he hears and receives new information from the angel, Joseph is again able to change his decision from divorcing Mary to marrying her. God's plan of salvation always requires humán partners who are merciful as well as flexible upon reception of new information.

Some questions for reflection:

Who are the "least" ones in our society, and what does the Church do or not do for them?

What is one example in which you have changed your mind about something or someone with the help of new information?

How does our society generally define "righteousness"?

I pray you all have a Blessed Christmas and that our fellowship in Church is spread widely throughout family, city and countryside. Let us all rejoice in once again hearing the message of the angels and hosts of heaven on this day: "Glory to God in the Highest and on earth, peace to people of goodwill...for today is born a Savior - Christ the Lord."

Offer a prayer to our Patron, St. John on the 27th. It is his feast day. Also, please note that New Year's Day falls on a Monday and the obligation for Mass is removed. We will celebrate our regular schedule of Masses next Saturday and Sunday. There will be no Mass on January 1st.





History in the Making

The current St. John Church is the third church at this location after the church parish was established in 1850. The first church was built in 1850 and burned down in 1858. The second church was completed in 1861 but the congregation was unable to pay the builder in full. The builder sued the church for payment and was awarded the church building and land by the court. The Diocese of New Orleans bought the church back from the builder and the congregation paid the diocese back over many years. When the Plaquemine Locks system was built, the pounding for the pilings severely damaged the structure of the church so much that it had to be replaced. The third church was completed in 1927 and still stands today as the "cathedral on the bayou." The mid 1920's were the years of the Great Depression yet our church forefathers built this church that we are now determined to repair for future generations. It is on the National Register of Historic Places as part of the Plaquemine Historic District established October 30, 1989.
