The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph December 31, 2023

Remember, Reflect, Respond

This feast has had several names through history. Strangely, the title that is most confusing to non-Catholics is the official one. When we call Mary the Mother of God, we are not saying that she somehow preceded God or is equal to God. We are simply recognizing that her human son Jesus is also the divine Son of God.

Today's Gospel records one simple action of Mary: to keep these things in her heart. Even in this simple sentence we are given a things in her heart. Even in this simple sentence we are given a good example of being a disciple. Like Mary, we need to both keep, or remember, what God has done, and to reflect on what we remember. First, how much do we remember about what God has done for us? How well do we know the stories of salvation found in the scriptures? Do we recall the prayers God has answered, the guidance given, the love of God that others have shown us, the times God has forgiven us?

Second, how much do we reflect on what God has done? Even if we have many memories of God's goodness to us, we also need to pray over them and ask ourselves how we have changed because of what God has done. Do I forgive hurts more readily? Do I share my faith with my family or friends? Do I support my parish with my time or offerings? Let us ask God's help to imitate Mary by remembering and reflecting. Tom Schmidt





Pastor's Letter

Dear Family:

This weekend's liturgy centers around The Holy Family. Joseph and Mary offer in the Temple for Jesus' birth "a pair of turtledoves or

Jesus' birth "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Such an offering is prescribed in Leviticus 12 for the poor who cannot afford a lamb or a sheep. From this, we can deduce that Luke's Jesus is born into a poor family. The image of the newborn Jesus lying in a manger is consistent with this picture. Given the less - than - desirable circumstances of Jesus' birth, it may be difficult for the couple to hold on to the angel's pronouncement to Mary about Jesus, especially given Simeon's words to Mary that "you yourself a sword will pierce".

Abraham and Sarah held onto God's faithful promise to them of descendants and land. Both were advanced in age, but they went out, "dwelling in tents" and "not knowing where" they were going. Unlike Simeon, who was able to see the messiah before his death, they died seeing neither the promised multiplication of descendants nor the promised land. Defining faith as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen," Hebrews 11 was written to encourage a community wavering in their faith.

We witness God's faithfulness in these passages. We also see the need for our response in faith, and that faith requires endurance and action. Just as Abraham and Sarah made the move out of Ur, Joseph and Mary offer a sacrifice out of their limited means and, by faith in what they have heard from Simeon and Anna (as well as from the angel Gabriel and the shepherds), they do the hard work of raising and parenting Jesus.

Some questions for reflection:

What challenges keep you, our parish, or society from seeing a way forward?

Whose example do you lean on when your faith wavers? How do you imagine God's faithfulness?

I pray you all have a great beginning to 2024 in the year of our Lord. Please remember our concert for St. John School will take place next Sunday, January 7th at 4:00 p.m. I look forward to sharing the gift of music with you all again at our Epiphany concert. Tickets are still available through the office.

St. John Church 100 Years Capital Campaign Tidbit Did vou know?

- How old is the church's clock tower? It was built in 1879 and ٠ installed by then Reverend Harnais. It has stood steadily over time for two of the three churches built at this location. The bells were rung for the city for fires and other events warranting notification of the citizens of Plaquemine.
- Do the bells in the bell tower have names? Yes. The original bell used as the city's fire alarm cracked and was replaced by "Joanna" Maria" in 1885 and then "Anna" in 1888.
- **Do the bells in the bell tower work?** Not any longer; the wooden cradles that held the large brass bells collapsed after many years of weathering the weather. A recording of bells ringing is currently used to announce Mass, weddings, funerals and other events at the church. Research has been done to consider installing metal cradles and that the statemeta bell weather the weather installing metal cradles that the statemeta to announce the statemeta the work of the statemeta the statemeta to announce the statemeta and stationary bell ringers to replace the wooden cradles so that the bells may be used once again. It is listed as one of the Phase 3 projects of the 100 Years Capital Campaign.

Please prayerfully consider what you can do to help restore St. John Church as well as your regular tithe that "keeps the lights on." As Jesus taught us in Mark 12:42-44, "Then a poor widow came and put in two very small coins, worth less than a penny. Jesus called his followers to him and said, "This poor widow put in only two small coins. But the truth is that she gave all that she had, more than all those rich people. They have plenty and they gave only what they did not need."

Our goal is to have 95% of us contributing since this is OUR church. It's a very big goal but doable if we all do something to help OUR church.
