The Ascension of the Lord May 12, 2024

Exalted in Glory

All three readings talk about Jesus being taken up into heaven or in a cloud or on high. These descriptions of the ascension actually tell us that Jesus is reunited with his Father and exalted in glory with the Father. Jesus not only has a new life that cannot be ended by death, he also is no longer limited by time or space as he was before he died. So what does that mean for us?

Because he is not limited, he can be with us everywhere. Through his Spirit, he gives us the power and the courage to act as Jesus and the vision of faith to see Jesus in others. Now this takes some practice. One way we learn is through the lives of the saints. We see how God works through them to do great things. We learn that they become more and more like Jesus, in how they treat others with love and respect.

But if the saints seem too distant, we can look at someone we love. Whether it is a parent, spouse, brother, sister or friend, the good that they do and the love they

show is from God. So we can learn about God's love for us by letting ourselves be loved by another.

The other side of the coin is seeing Jesus in ourselves. We may have to forgive ourselves for the bad choices we have made in the past, or the bad habits we still have. We also have to accept that God really does love us as his children. And we have to accept that sometimes, even when we do our best, we still seem to fail. But the God who brings life out of death also brings success out of failure. So trust his promise that we have Jesus in us.

Then do your best to follow Jesus and you may lead someone else to him.

Pastor's Letter

May 12, 2024

Dear Family:

This weekend as we are celebrating the Ascension of Our Lord, our national culture pays tribute to the role of our Mothers in our lives. A most Happy Mothers Day to all of our Moms and those who are like Moms for us. There will be a special blessing of Mothers this weekend.

Many Thanks to Mrs. Jane Boudreaux and our St. John School Students who displayed their enlightening art work last weekend. So many parishioners and visitors expressed pride and gratitude at the students' creativity..

Thanks again to our Knights of Columbus Council for hosting, preparing and serving a banquet for those who spend time in the Adoration Chapel. This annual gathering strengthens our love of the Eucharist and provides a wonderful opportunity for reflection and fellowship.

The St. Joseph Altar Society gathered for an appreciation luncheon as well. As we gathered for that meal we heard from a woman who sent our leftover St. Joseph Altar cookies overseas to the members of our military. No grace of God goes wasted at St. John. The hard work of our Altar Society and St. Joseph Altar Committee is a blessing.

The next few weekends will be filled with end of school year activities at school and at church. We'll celebrate a Baccalaureate Mass for our St. John High School graduates, their graduation and the Ring Ceremony for Juniors.

Our Gospel passage is part of the farewell discourse of Jesus (Jn 13-17), as he prepares his disciples for his crucifixion and departure. More specifically, it is part of a prayer in which Jesus prays for his disciples, who will be left in the world without his physical presence.

The intercessory prayer of Jesus in John 17:11b-19 is a prayer for the disciples' protection, but it involves several specific elements. First, there is a specific concern for the disciples' unity (Jn 17:11b).

Second, the prayer specifies two reasons why protection is needed for the disciples: (1) "the evil one" and the presence of hate rob the disciples of a sense of belonging in this world (Jn 17:14-16); and (2) the disciples are sent into this world just as Jesus has been sent because the world is the object of God's ongoing love and mission (Jn 17:18).

Third, there is a specific request for God to set the disciples apart; namely, their sanctification in truth, which is equated with God's Word (Jn 17:17,19). Earlier in the prayer, Jesus has stated that he has already given to his disciples the word that he has received from God (Jn 17:8), so we know that the truth is none other than Jesus' word and, according to Jn 14:6, Jesus himself. After all, the Word has become flesh in Jesus, and this Word has "the words of eternal life" (Jn 6:69). Since the two references to sanctification enclose the sending of the disciples in God's mission of love, their sanctification does not mean their isolation or quarantine from the world, but rather, their loyalty to Jesus and to God.

Some questions for reflection:

What is the significance of this connection that is being repeatedly emphasized among Jesus, the Father, and the disciples?

It makes sense that love, mission, and protection appear in this passage, but what can we say about the somewhat sudden reference to joy in John 17:13?

How can we be a part of the world and yet be set apart from the world?
