#### **Royal Treatment**

St. James is exaggerating a little when he describes how people might greet visitors or new members in the church. Sadly, prejudice is a sin that is just as prevalent today as it was 2000 years ago. Today we have laws for business and government to prevent prejudice. But the subtler forms of judging people by their race, clothing, speech, religion, etc. sometimes hide behind patriotism, faith, or the desire to protect our families.

One reason for prejudice is ignorance. When you get an e-mail that says "true Americans" are white, English-speaking Christians, there is probably some prejudice behind it. The only way to fight ignorance is with the truth. Jesus himself said the truth will set you free. (Jn 8:32) He told us that God loves all people, even sinners, so what right do we have to judge someone just because they are different? A second reason for prejudice is fear. We are told that certain

neighborhoods are dangerous. Or an older adult sees three teenage boys walking down the street and because of her fear, she thinks they could be gang members. But remember how many times Jesus tells us in the gospels, "Do not be afraid."

If we can learn to see Christ in all peoples, regardless of their race or lifestyle, we are beginning to leave prejudice behind. If we teach our children to respect the poor, the disabled, the homeless, we can help them to understand what James meant about God choosing the "poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom." (Jas 2:5)



Pastor's Letter September 8, 2024

Dear Family:

This week's readings are powerful calls to attend to those who are the most marginalized in our societies. All four selections indicate that God is particularly interested in and concerned for those who need God most, what the Church has deemed God's "preferential option for the poor." Isaiah sends comfort to those who find themselves living in fear. Water, the power over which the Scriptures assign to

God alone, symbolizes God's sustaining the faithful in even the dire situations this world might impose. Psalm 146 likewise extols God's justice for the oppressed.

James' letter to the early Christian communities is known for his challenge to the rich. In our passage he focuses on God's impartiality in welcoming people from all social strata into relationship with God. He further suggests that the marginalized in this world are especially close to God. They are rich in faith and equal heirs in the kingdom of God. This message is especially powerful in a particularly hierarchical and classist society.

Mark continues this sort of teaching in his Gospel account of Jesus encountering a man limited in both hearing and speaking in the Gentile region of the Decapolis. Jesus, like the scriptural teaching about God, shows partiality for neither class nor ethnicity as he interacts with one who needs him and has been brought to him in faith.

Some questions for reflection:

The Scriptures challenge Christians to work for justice for all people, regardless of race, gender, class, or ethnicity. What more can you do to work for justice?

James summons us to cross social and class boundaries to welcome the "other" into our churches, our community, and our hospitable gatherings. How might you rise to this challenge?

Do you believe in miracles? If not, why not? if so, what do they look like in your twenty-first century context? Are there ways that we can better recognize God' miraculous activity in our lives and in the world around us?

I pray you all had a blessed Labor Day and that our days ahead together are blessed.




