

Beware of the Dark Side

Do you remember the Star Wars movies, in which the Dark Side was a symbol of evil? In our second reading Paul tells the Christians in Ephesus that they were once darkness. Paul uses darkness as a symbol of shame. Shame is not just sorrow for sins; it is the fear of being caught in sin, or of telling our weaknesses to another because we think the other will look down on us. Paul was a sinner himself and was blinded when Jesus appeared to him, asking, "Why do you persecute me?" So he knew that the only way to be free of shame is not to hide sins, but to expose them.

Does that mean we have to broadcast our sins on the evening news, or post them all on our social media pages? No; we just need to confess them to God and receive God's forgiveness. We can do this through the sacrament of reconciliation. The priest shows that God

loves sinners, no matter what they have done. If you wreck your car, you take it to the repair shop and tell the mechanics what is broken so they can repair it. In reconciliation we bring our sins to the priest so that we can experience forgiveness.

Sometimes other people try to shame us. In the Gospel, Jesus told the Pharisees that they were the sinners, because they had judged the blind man. So when we know that God forgives us and still loves us, we don't have to fear what others might think. Let us instead hold our sins up to the light of forgiveness and be free of our shame. The Sisters of the Holy Family



Sr. Laura Mercier, S.S.F

This weekend, Laetare Sunday, March 14th and 15th, Sister Laura Mercier of the Sisters of the Holy Family will speak at all the weekend Masses about the mission of her religious congregation and the great financial need in which they currently find themselves. Founded on November 21, 1842, the Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary by the Venerable Mother Henriette Delille, the Sisters of the Holy Family originally cared for orphans and the sick, taught the slaves when Louisiana's law prohibited them, served the elderly and shared what they had with the poor and needy. They continue to serve as teachers and care for the elderly.

Mother Henriette Delille died on November 17, 1862 at the age of 50. In 1988, her cause for canonization was opened. From 1988 until 2005, her life, virtues and reputation for sanctity were diligently studied. On March 27, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI announced to the world that Henriette Delille had practiced heroic virtue and declared her Venerable. She is the first native born African American whose cause for canonization has been officially opened by the Church. The Sisters of the Holy Family

continue the legacy of the Venerable Henriette Delille by addressing the present day needs of the poor, sick and elderly through education, healthcare services, pastoral care, prison ministry, and promoting social justice. In their various ministries, the Sisters serve as administrators, teachers, pastoral personnel, housing managers, librarians, and catechists. They minister in schools in New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Lafayette, and Alexandria, Louisiana, and at Lafon Nursing Facility in New Orleans, the oldest continually

operating nursing home in the United States. They manage two apartment complexes for low-income senior citizens: Delille Inn and St. John Berchmans Manor.

Venerable Henriette Delille
 Servant of Slaves
 Founder of the Sisters of the Holy Family
 New Orleans 1812 - 1862



In 1842, as slave holders vehemently defended slavery and denounced free people of African descent, Henriette Delille, a descendant of slaves, founded the Sisters of the Holy Family. The Sisters, all free women of African descent, dedicated themselves to caring for the neediest of the needy, enslaved and free.

Today the Sisters continue to follow Delille's path. In 1988, in recognition of her heroic virtues, Saint Pope John Paul II opened her Cause for Canonization, declaring her "Servant of God." In 2010, she was declared "Venerable."

Join us in praying for her beatification.

Prayer for the Canonization of Mother Delille:

O good and gracious God, You called Henriette Delille to give herself in service and in love to the slaves and the sick, to the orphan and the aged, to the forgotten and the despised.

Grant that inspired by her life, we might be renewed in heart and in mind. If it be Your will, may she one day be raised to the honor of sainthood. By her prayers, may we live in harmony and peace, through Jesus Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

Pilgrimage to the National Shrine of Saint Roch

Built in Fulfillment of a Vow in 1867

Campo Santo #1 + 1725 Saint Roch Avenue + New Orleans

Monday, March 23rd

Leaving St. John Church, Plaquemine 8:00 a.m.

At first, St. Roch Campo Santo Cemetery #1 doesn't look like anything out of the ordinary for a New Orleans graveyard. However, this quiet old cemetery is home to one of the most religious of settings in the Crescent City: the National Shrine of St. Roch, Mendicant Saint of Montpellier, France, patron of those suffering during pestilence and diseases, and heavenly patron of dogs. The neighborhood previously known as Faubourg Franklin became the St. Roch Neighborhood in the 1850's. In the times of the yellow fever epidemics which ravaged the Crescent City, the Pastor of Holy Trinity Church for German Catholics on St. Ferdinand Street, the Reverend Peter Leonard Thevis, prayed to St. Roch for his parishioners' health. St. Roch was believed to be a healer and protector of health by his congregation. Father Thevis made a vow that he would build a chapel in honor of St. Roch in the first parish cemetery (Campo Santo #1) if no one from his parish died from the yellow fever. Sure enough, no one in his parish died from yellow fever in over a decade. This meant that it was time to go through with his part of the deal. So, soon a chapel was built in honor of St. Roch.

The Shrine lies in a tall, two-room building, one of which contains an altar and a statue of St. Roch and his beloved dog. The other room is filled with *ex votos*, plaques of gratitude from the faithful who were cured through St. Roch's intercession from 1867 through the middle of the 20th century. Some of these *ex votos* are in the form of body part (representing the part of the body which suffered) and crutches and leg braces used by the faithful and no longer needed after they were cured. Until the late 1960's, novenas, devotions and Holy Masses were celebrated regularly at the Shrine, especially around the feast of St. Roch on August 16th. The Stations of the Cross are still popular at the Campo Santo on Good Friday.
