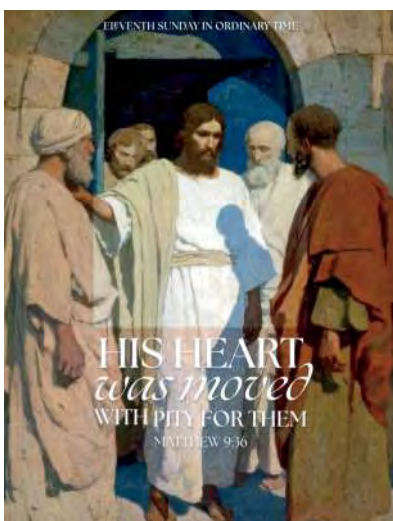

Free of Charge

Knowing that God keeps his promises is part of being a believer. And how do we know that? Because we see how he has kept them throughout history. If we lose hope or begin to doubt that he will help us, it's useful to remember what he has already done. Saint Paul talks about this in the second reading. Christ died for us while we were sinners, and so Saint Paul concludes that, having been saved from sin, we will also be saved from death. We are free from sin and death. And isn't that enough?

Jesus shows us that God can do even more. When he saw the crowds in today's Gospel, he felt compassion for them because they were "like sheep without a shepherd." They seemed to need leaders, someone who could show them the way to God. So Jesus responds in two ways.

First, he teaches his disciples to pray for more leaders. What he means is that if people are going to lead the Church, they must be sent by God. They are not elected

by popular vote. They are "chosen" or called by God to serve. Jesus is teaching us to pray for the leaders of the Church today. We can pray for all those in a leadership role, that they may be filled with wisdom and strength. Jesus also teaches us to pray for vocations to religious life.

The second thing Jesus does is send the twelve apostles to proclaim the Kingdom and heal illnesses. He teaches us that action must go hand in hand with prayer. This may mean offering our help to parish leaders, serving a term on the parish council, or encouraging our children to consider a religious vocation.

Why should we do these things? Remember what Paul said, that God saves us from sin and death. God gives us these gifts at no cost. He simply asks us to spread the good news of salvation. That's what leadership within the Church is all about. By Tom Schmidt

Praised be Jesus Christ and Mary most holy!

This weekend will we have our last Sunday Masses at St. John Church. Tomorrow morning, Monday, June 15, weekday Masses will begin to be celebrated in the Parish Hall. Funerals will commence at St. Clement and Sunday Masses will be celebrated there beginning next weekend. While we are at St. Clement, we will not have Holy Communion under both *species*... meaning, we will only receive the Sacred Host. This is because of the tight space at St. Clement. Once we return to St. John Church the weekend of August 16, we will resume having Holy Communion under both species, and offer the Precious Blood as well as the Sacred Host.

As I have already mentioned, Saturday, July 4 is the hundredth anniversary of the laying of the cornerstone of St. John Church. It is also the 250th Birthday of our Country. While I was planning on having a little prayer service at the cornerstone outside of St. John Church, I had forgotten that I committed to leading the opening prayer for the city's July 4th celebration. Therefore, we won't be having the prayer at the cornerstone, or a reception in the Parish Hall. The 4:00 p.m. Holy Mass at St. Clement on July 4th will be a celebration of the laying of our cornerstone, as well as the Birthday of our Nation.

ORGAN NEWS and OPPORTUNITY TO DONATE: Our Allen electronic organ in St. John Church is on its "last legs" so to speak. The organ is old, and the company no longer makes parts for it. After research, I have found a very nice digital electronic organ for \$20,000. It is being offered to us for a very good price. There would be an additional cost of about \$5,000 to professionally have it lifted up into the choir loft, voiced and installed. We would bless and dedicate it once we have it and are back to St. John Church. I would like to purchase the organ while it is still available, and have it installed before the Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady on Saturday morning, August 15th. Please spread the word. Remember that God will not be outdone in generosity.

The Great Beauty Behind the Church's Use of Beeswax Candles in the Sacred Liturgy

According to Ivo of Chartres, the wax, which is formed from the juice of flowers by the bee, always considered as the emblem of virginity, signifies the virginal flesh of the Divine Infant, who diminished not, either by His conception or His birth, the spotless purity of His Blessed Mother. The same holy bishop would have us see, in the flame of our Candle, a symbol of Jesus who came to enlighten our darkness. St. Anselm, Archbishop of Canterbury, speaking on the same mystery, bids us consider three things in the blessed Candle: the wax, the wick, and the flame. The wax, he says, which is the production the virginal bee, is the Flesh of our Lord; the wick, which is within, is His Soul; the flame, which burns on top, is His divinity.

This is quite fascinating – the symbolic connection of the bees as emblems of virginity – the wax symbolizing the flesh of our Lord. Researching deeper on this topic, Catholic author and columnist, Catherine Croisette, expands on this theme in an article she penned titled, "The Bee, A Symbol of the Church":

St. John Chrysostom...wrote: "The bee is more honored than other animals, not because it labors, but because it labors for others" (12th Homily)." So, I realized that the bees, like the clergy and religious men and women in the Church, work unceasingly for the common good of the hive and obey without question their superiors, and above all their queen.

The symbolism of bees also signifies the way the Church generates her spiritual fruits because bees are virginal, they don't have any sexual contact. As the Church gives grace through the purity of her divine Sacraments, so the bees give us honey and wax by the labor of their pure bodies. This is why their wax, considered the fruit of a virgin labor, is worthy to burn in the candles on the altar at the offering of the Holy Sacrifice.

Did you know that only honey bees make wax?

They are able to convert honey into wax by secreting little wax "scales" from their abdomens. To make 1 pound of wax it requires 24 to 30 pounds of amount of honey. It takes about 1100 of these to make one gram of wax. It is no wonder that beeswax is so precious.
